Don Bosco's Educational System

John Melchior Bosco, (16 August 1815 – 31 January 1888), popularly known as Don Bosco, was an Italian Roman Catholic priest, educator and writer. While working in Turin, where the population suffered many of the ill effects of industrialization and urbanization. He dedicated his life to the betterment and education of street children, juvenile delinquents, and other disadvantaged youth. He developed teaching methods based on love rather than punishment, a method that became known as the Salesian Preventive System.

Through the ages there have been two systems used in the education of the young: preventive and repressive. The repressive approach revolves around law and punishments. The preventive system is based on reason, religion and loving-kindness. It consists in making known the rules and regulations of an Institute, and then supervising in such a way that the students are always under the vigilant eye of the Staff, who like loving fathers will deal with them. This system gives them ample liberty to jump, run, and make a din as much as they please. Gymnastics, games, music, theatricals, hikes, etc., are very effective methods for getting discipline; they favour good living and good health.

The Learning Experience at DBASC

An in-depth Teaching-Learning Experience

At DBASC, the foundation of teaching and learning is based on Bloom's Taxonomy where both lower order and higher order thinking blends. Students are taken through the six knowledge-levels of learning. Such a focus sets the tone for an Outcome Based Education (OBE). The outcomes are clearly spelt out right at the beginning of any teaching and learning process. The sign-post approach makes students to meaningfully participate in their personal learning process.

100% Results

One of the primary objectives of the college is to help students to clear all their papers at the University examinations. Several initiatives are taken to achieve it: daily assignments, daily tests, remedial teaching, question bank, etc.

Skill-oriented Training

To prepare for their future, the students are trained in the job oriented skills such as English communication skills, fast typing skills, computing skills, graphical designing, mathematical ability, foreign languages learning (German), etc.

Communicative English Training

After a screening test, according to the English language proficiency of the students, they are categorised according to their levels. Communicative English training is given to them to prepare them for their academic studies and for their professional life.

Value Education and Religion Classes

The main focus of education at Don Bosco institutions is to form good and honest citizens. Such an education is rooted in the value system inspired by Don Bosco. Here, at DBASC, students are exposed to ethical values that will guide them all through their lives.

Admission Policy

Eligibility Criteria

Candidates who have completed the Higher Secondary Examination or other equivalent studies recognized by the University of Madras are eligible to apply for the Undergraduate programmes.

Admission Procedure

Registration and Application forms for admission to B.A./B.Com./B.C.A./B.Sc./M.Sc./M.S.W Programmes can be obtained from the college website. (www.dbcc.edu.in)

1. Candidates who have completed or written the XII Std examinations need to **Register themselves** in the college website www.dbcc.edu.in They need to follow the instructions provided there. They may start registering from the 28th March, 2026.

Call to the candidate from College → Come to the Campus →

Fillin App Form → Interview → Entrance Exam (if needed) → Admission → Payment & Submission of Original Certificates.

2. When registration is successful, the **Application Number** and **Password** will be generated and a telephone call will be received by you from our office. You need to note down your **Application Number** and the **Password**.
3. Registration and Application fees of Rs.100/- is to be paid online.
4. When the candidate is called to the office, s/he will be given all the details related to the admission. Also, one could clarify their doubts over the phone numbers given.
5. When the candidate is asked to report to the college, kindly come along with parents and bring the following documents:
 - X & XI Mark Sheets (XII Mark Sheet could be submitted after the publication of the results)
 - Community Certificate
 - Transfer/Conduct Certificate
 - 3 Passport Size Photos
 - Differently Abled students, Sports/Games students and Ex-Servicemen's children need to bring the relevant documents
 - A copy of the Aadhaar
 - Christian students need to get a letter from the Parish priest/Pastor
6. An interview will be conducted for the candidates.
7. Once the admission is confirmed the fees will have to be paid and get admitted.

Selection Process

- The Original documents and the filled-in Application Form must be presented at the interview.
- An entrance test may be conducted if needed, to assess a candidate.
- Selected candidates must pay the prescribed fees and submit the original certificates at the College Office.

Note: Any false information will result in cancellation of admission.

Reservation Policy

The college follows the reservation policy of the Government of Tamil Nadu:

1. 31% for Open Competition (OC)
2. 26.5% for Backward Classes (BC) other than BC Muslims and 3.5% for Backward Class Muslims
3. 20% for the Most Backward Classes (MBC) and Denotified Communities (DNC)
4. 15% for Scheduled Castes (SC) and 3% for SCA
5. 1% for Scheduled Tribes (ST)
6. As a minority college offering unaided programmes, 50% of seats shall be filled-in by minority students. In case of vacant seats out of this 50%, the rules of reservation of the TN govt. shall be followed.

Note: Sport/Games students based on their achievements may be exempted from college fees either fully or partially.

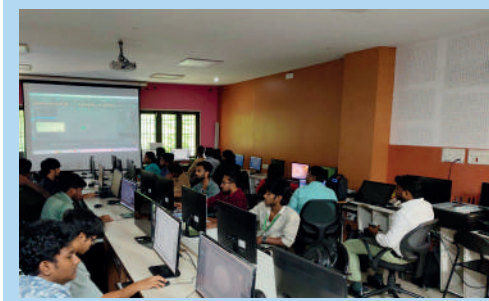

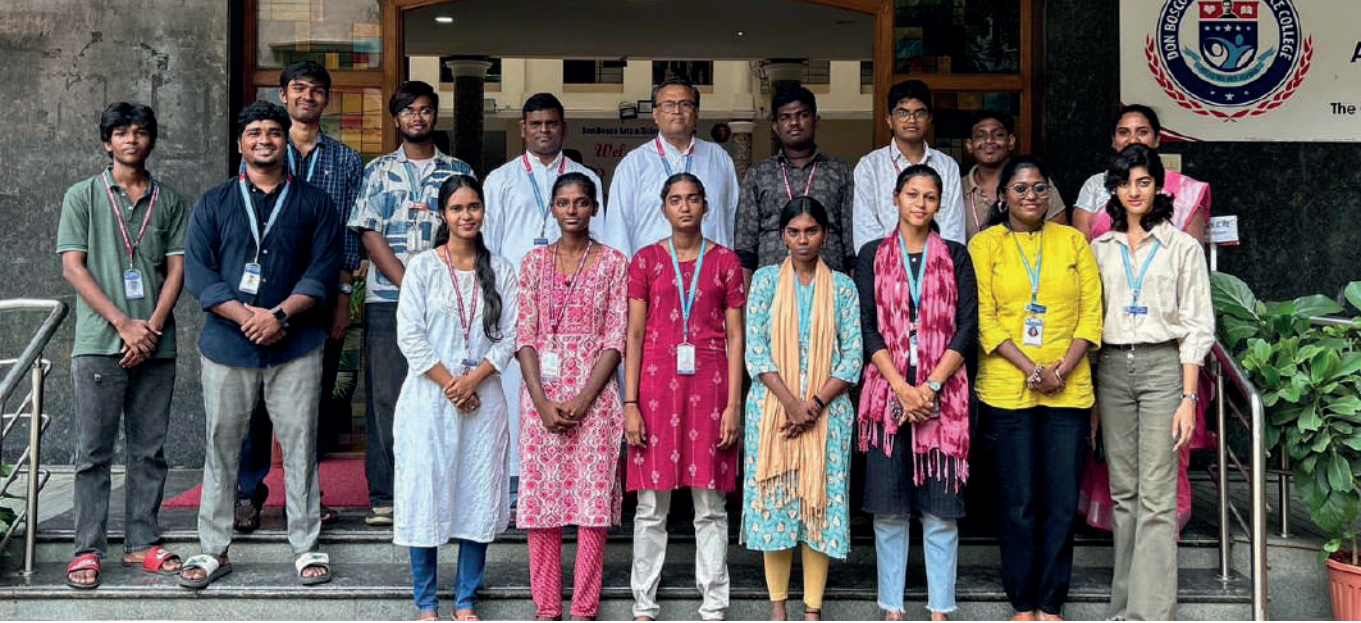
Interactive-panel Classrooms

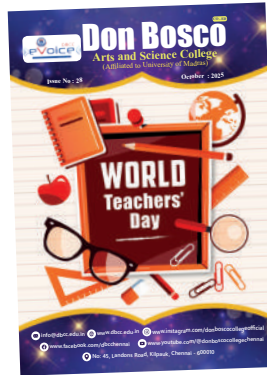

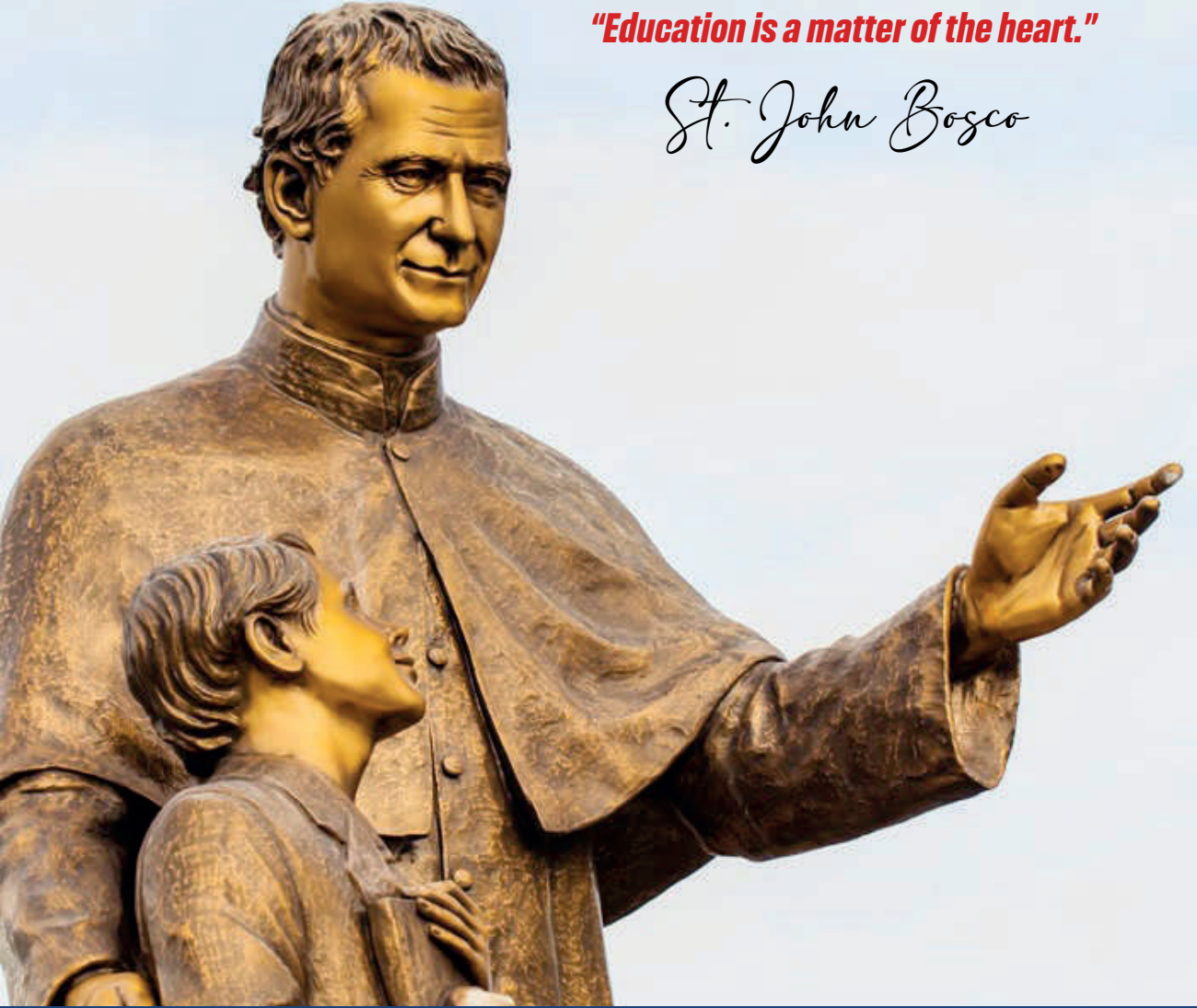
Some of the Salesian alumni are already highly placed; through their mentoring, the aspiring present students are given a hand-holding, one to one, are specially trained and placed.
