


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## My dear staff and students,



This visit provided students with a firsthand look at the production processes of Masco Tea, an organic tea brand produced in the picturesque town of Vagamon. The Masco Tea Factory, operated by the Malanad Service Co-operative Bank Ltd., was established to ensure local farmers receive fair prices for their green tea leaves. The factory's production process includes plucking, withering, rolling, oxidising, drying, and sorting tea leaves to achieve the desired flavour, aroma, and appearance. The factory produces nine grades of tea. On 25th January 2025, students of III B.Com General, accompanied by three staff members, visited Cochin Port from 4:00 PM to 5:00 PM via boat. Cochin Port, one of India's largest ports, is a major hub on the Arabian Sea-Laccadive Sea-Indian Ocean sea route. During the visit, students observed the loading of containers onto international ships. The Cochin Port also exports marine products, tea, coffee, and cotton goods, with top destinations being the UAE, USA, and China.

Students observed how classroom knowledge is applied to real-world production processes, machinery, and operations. Students also embarked on a tour of Vagamon and Cochin where they visited beautiful green meadows, the serene pine forest, and the picturesque Elaveezha Poonchira, creating joyful and pleasant memories with their classmates.

#### SPEECH BY GROUP CAPTAIN RAJARATHNAM PRAKASH

1. This Don Bosco SIGA campus is like a homecoming for me, as I used to frequent this place to meet Rev Fr Robert Simon and Fr Rajkumar, who were Salesian brothers then, studying in Loyola College with me. It is in the most important period of my life, as a youth, when you are learning the ways of the world. I was blessed to have these two Salesian brothers guiding my steps in the most friendly way of love and laughter, in the language which young people best understand.

2. Though India became a free nation on August 15, 1947, it declared itself a Sovereign, Democratic and Republic state with the adoption of the Constitution on January 26, 1950. A salute of 21 guns and the unfurling of the Indian National Flag by Dr. Rajendra Prasad heralded the historic birth of the Indian Republic on that

day. Thereafter 26th of January was recognised as the Republic Day of India. The Constitution gave the citizens of India the power to choose their own government and paved the way for democracy. Dr. Rajendra Prasad took oath as the first President of India at the Durbar Hall in Government House and this was followed by the Presidential drive along a five-mile route to the Irwin Stadium, where he unfurled the National Flag. Dr. Bhimrao Ramji Ambedkar was the Law Minister at the time, and he presented the final text of the Constitution to the Constituent Assembly. While we celebrate Republic Day, We should realise the vision of the enormous number of freedom fighters who sacrificed their lives, families and fought non-violently against the mighty British for this valuable freedom which we are enjoying today.

3. You may think that if I have to serve the Nation, I have to join the Defence Forces or Police Forces etc. It is not just them who serve the nation, it is every Indian who does his duty as a citizen is serving the Nation. For example, A professor, who put his or her best efforts to teach, guide and ignite the minds of the students is serving the country, the students who are self disciplined and makes the best use of the education and all-round development available in this campus and goes back home safely following the traffic rules , is serving the nation. A non-teaching staff who are taking good care of this campus' cleanliness to provide a conducive learning environment is serving the Nation. The greatest leaders are found within the four walls of our homes, 'our parents'. While our fathers provide the necessities, our mothers who are homemakers and are bringing up good citizens for this country are directly serving the nation. Imagine the working women professionals who consider their work as a family and also take care of their homes, they are direct Nation Builders.



4. Dreams and foundations of life are laid in this important period of your life, youth. The dreams of every young Indian present here, and the strong foundation given to you by this institution is the foundation of your life and this great nation, India. I wish to quote Dr APJ Abdul Kalam who lists out the unique qualities of the Young People. I quote,

Courage to think different, Courage to invent, Courage to discover the impossible, Courage to travel into an unexplored path, Courage to share the knowledge Courage to remove the pain Courage to reach the unreached Courage to combat the problems

And Succeed', Unquote.

Everyone here, including me sitting on this stage, always revisit our days of youth, whenever we are faced with impossibilities, difficulties and the struggle to achieve, we get back to the strong foundation of our youth which we laid for ourselves with sheer hard work. This strong backing helps us to succeed. It is said, "You cannot be Old and wise, unless you have never been young and crazy."





5. Talking from personal experience, Winston Churchill advices the youth, I quote,

"You have not an hour to lose. You must take your place in life's fighting line. Twenty to twenty five ! These are the years ! Don't be content with things as they are! The World is yours. Don't accept a 'No' for an answer. Never submit to failure. You will make all kind of mistakes :but as long as you are generous, true, and fierce, you cannot hurt the world or seriously distress it. The world was made to be wooed and won by the youth."

6. I was Commanding Officer of a frontline transport Squadron. Out of the 56 officers, 31 of them around the age of 25-26 years. Ever energetic young men and women officers and pilots. All my heads of Flying Operations, Aircraft Engineering and Administration had difficulty in managing them. I used to tell them to go to their level of thinking and train them for war. Every month, I used to sit with them in an informal gathering and encouraged them to ask questions, however silly they were. I asked my heads to know about every rule and policy to explain to them. I used to tell them that this generation is not a "yes sir" generation, this is a generation which needs answers and explanations. In few months time, I found these young officers out performing in the duties assigned to them, much more than the expectations of the Air Force. Another important lesson I learnt in the AirForce is the power of women professionals. The women in the Air Force have broken all barriers and are fully operational fighter pilots. The National Defence Academy at Pune has inducted women trainees and the first batch is about to pass out. The Academy was skeptical of the women cadet's performance in tough physical training, so the Academy kept the physical training standards lesser compared to the men cadets. When the Chief of Defence Staff visited them, these young girls represented to him that they needed to compete with the men in their same physical training and nothing less. The Academy made the training as tough as the men and believe me, the girls are out performing the boys. In few decades from now, I have no doubts that the world will see the first Women Chief of the Army, Navy or the Indian Air Force.

7. As a young boy, who Fr Rajkumar would recollect me as, I read a small self-help book named, 'The Power of Positive thinking' by Norman Vincent Peale. This book guided me in realizing my dreams. This book gave me a very powerful Bible Verse from the letter of St. Paul to Philippians Chapter 4:13, which says, "I can do all things through Christ, who Strengthens me." Or "I can do all things through God, who strengthens me". Spirituality gives us the strength and moral courage to defeat failures and keep moving forward towards our dream. And



believe you, failures teach us more than successes. The other important point I wish to make is to read books, any books of any language, any topic, short stories or whatever. Reading makes you think, your thinking makes you dream, your dream with focused handwork and smart work will lead you to discover your dream. You will face failures, but they teach you many many valuable lessons to achieve success. This entire process is the vision you have to form and keep revisiting it . The beautiful Motto of this esteemed institution, "Ad Astra per Aspera" "Through hardship to the stars", there is no substitute to handwork and hand work always pays. When you succeed, your institution or organisation and your family succeeds, your Country succeeds... And that will make India a Superpower.


